Education

Teacher professional learning (TPL) helps teachers and staff gain insight into and knowledge of their craft. It encourages the development of new ways of thinking about content and new approaches to teaching. This will substantially affect student achievement over a sustained period of time. Changes in teaching practice and improved student achievement need to be observed and/or measured.

In implementing changed practice, teachers acquire new knowledge, modify their existing beliefs and attitudes in relation to their teaching and sustain that change over time. This change in teaching practice needs to correlate strongly with the improvement of specified student outcomes.

Our staff at Avoca PS are mandated by Departmental Policy to attend and develop their craft through a series of Professional Development workshops. These workshops occur across the year and are set out for teacher and school leader professional growth.

Please be advised that as we move into our new Strategic Direction and Plan for the 2018-2020 period many new courses and workshops are provisioned for the staff to maintain currency of skills and, safety and wellbeing procedures for all.
